

In a round the same melody is played or sung by two or more people starting at different times.







Your tongue and your fingers should move at exactly the same time.

In **½** meter the top number (5) tells that there are 5 beats in each measure. The bottom number (4) tells that a quarter note (4) gets 1 beat.











1 eighth note () lasts half as long as 1 quarter note ().
2 eighth notes () or) are equal to 1 quarter note ().
1 eighth rest () gets one half beat of silence.









Without raising your shoulders, keep your lips on the mouthpiece as you breathe through the corners of your mouth.


Common Time (C) is the same as a meter. There are 4 beats in each measure, and a quarter note (J) gets 1 beat.









You can add body percussion such as clap, snap, pat, stamp to the music on this page.




A **sharp** (#) placed before a note raises the pitch of that note one half-step. The note stays "sharped" through the measure.



A sharp (#) placed on the fifth line at the beginning of each staff, is called the **key signature**. It means that every F must be played as F#.



Arms and elbows should be slightly raised, and away from the body.







Practice No. 42 slowly at first, and then gradually increase the tempo.







A dot after a note gets half the value of that note. 1 dotted quarter note and 1 eighth note together (4.4) get 2 beats.











A fermata (A) placed above a note means that the note is held a little longer than its usual count.





The 1st and 2nd ending signs 1. 2. mean that you must play from the beginning to the repeat sign () in the 1st ending. Then go back to the beginning or to this sign () and play the section again. This time you must skip the 1st ending and go directly to the 2nd ending.

In syncopation the accents move from the strong beats to the weak beats.





A staccato mark () means to play notes short and separated from each other. A tenuto mark () means to play notes for their fullest value.

Simile means to play in the same style as before.
